- **1. ISO is a worldwide federation of national standards bodies or groups known as the International Standardization Organization.**

True

False

Feedback: The answer is “True.” This is the definition of ISO discussed on Slide II-9.

Test Questions



- **2. Although not currently represented in the ISO, the United States is in the process of finalizing procedures to install the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) as its official representative.**

True

False

Feedback: The answer is “False.” The U.S. is currently represented in the ISO by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI). In addition, the American Society of Quality Control administers the Technical Advisory Group that inputs to Technical Committee 176. See Slide II-9.

- **3. A recent count of ISO members showed approximately 94 countries had a representative standard body as part of the membership.**

True

False

Feedback: The answer is “True.” The current membership does consist of approximately 94 countries and is still growing. See Slide II-9.

Test Questions



- **4. ISO 9000 Series Standards have been adopted in the United States as ANSI/ASQC Q9000 Series Standards (formerly Q90 Series).**

True

False

Feedback: The answer is “True.” The U.S. has adopted the ISO 9000 series through the technically equivalent ASQC Q9000 series. See Slide II-10.

Test Questions



- **5. ISO 9000 Series Standards were developed on a “clean slate” to avoid any preconceived ideas and prejudices contained in predecessor quality management publications.**

True

False

Feedback: The answer is “False.” ISO 9000 series standards were derived in part from well-known predecessors such as Mil-Q-9858A, NATO’s AQAP-1, and the British BS 5750 Series Quality Management Systems. See Slide II-10.

- **6. _____ is entitled “Quality Systems - Model for Quality Assurance in Design/Development, Production, Installation, and Servicing.”**
 - ***ISO 9001***
 - **ISO 9002**
 - **ISO 9003**
 - **ISO 9004**

Feedback: The answer is “ISO 9001.” ISO 9001 is the standard that provides the model quality elements for the entire life cycle. See Slide II-12.

- **7. Which of the following model quality elements is contained in only the ISO 9001 Standard?**
 - **Document and Data Control**
 - ***Design Control***
 - **Inspection and Testing**
 - **None of the above**

Feedback: The answer is “Design Control.” ISO 9001 provides the model quality element for Design Control (4.4). The other standards do not require it. See Slides II-13 and II-14.

- **8. Relative to ISO 9000 Series Standards, “quality system registration” refers to the assessment and periodic review of the adequacy of a supplier’s quality system by a third party.**

True

False

Feedback: The answer is “True.” Registration is the process of assessing a supplier by a registered third party against a chosen model quality system such as ISO 9001. See Slide II-18.

Test Questions



- **9. Relative to ISO 9000 Series Standards, a supplier’s quality system is “registered,” but this does not automatically imply the product or processes are “certified.”**

True

False

Feedback: The answer is “True.” Registration is the process of assessing a supplier by a registered third party against a chosen model quality system such as ISO 9001. Certification is a different review or approval of the actual product or processes. See Slide II-18.

- **10. One main requirement of Mil-Q-9858A, Quality Program Requirement, is that a contractor or supplier have a “Quality Program.”**

True

False

Feedback: The answer is “True.” A basic requirement of Mil-Q-9858A is that the contractor must have a quality program. See Slide II-20.

Test Questions



- **11. Mil-Q-9858A, Quality Program Requirements, has several similarities to ISO 9001, but one basic difference is that Mil-Q-9858A recognizes the “Government” while ISO 9001 generically only alludes to the “customer.”**

True

False

Feedback: The answer is “True.” A basic concept of Mil-Q-9858A is that it was developed by DOD and includes specific elements for the Government. ISO 9001 is generic. See Slide II-19.

- **12. NMI 1270.3, NASA Quality Management System Policy, is the NASA Agency NMI that establishes the policy for the use of ISO 9000 Standards by NASA and its suppliers.**

True

False

Feedback: The answer is “True.” NMI 1270.3 is the Agency policy on the use of ISO 9000 Standards. See Slide II-21.

Test Questions



- **13. Mil-I-45208A, Inspection System Requirements, requires a much more comprehensive quality program than Mil-Q-9858A.**

True

False

Feedback: The answer is “False.” The opposite is true. Mil-I-45208A requires only an inspection system while Mil-Q-9858A requires a quality program. See Slide II-24.

Test Questions



- **14. To comply with currently specified Federal Acquisition Regulation requirements, which of the following contractor management systems normally requires contracting officer approval?**
 - **Engineering/Design System**
 - ***Purchasing System***
 - **Security System**
 - **Test Management**

Feedback: The answer is “Purchasing.” FAR Part 44 requires Government formal review and approval of the Purchasing System by the contracting officer. See Slide II-31.

Test Questions



- **15. NASA Form 1018, Report of Government-owned/ Contractor-held Property, is the contractor report that provides NASA with the financial data on Government-furnished or contractor-acquired property in which the title is vested in the Government.**

True

False

Feedback: The answer is “True.” NF 1018 is required to be submitted for each contract by the prime contractor when the Government-owned/Contractor-held Property Clause is included in the contract. See Slide II-33.

- **16. When properly completed by the contractor, the NASA Form 1018 Report will provide which of the following information?**
 - **The type of property, its cost, and quantity**
 - **Contractor-acquired property received during the report period**
 - **Contractor property disposals during the report period**
 - ***All of the above***

Feedback: The answer is “All of the above.” When properly completed, NF 1018 will provide all of the cited information plus much more on the contractor-held Government property. See Slide II-34.

Test Questions



- **17. NASA Report 1018 is a annual report prepared exclusively by the Government Property Administrator with the concurrence of the contract administrator.**

True

False

Feedback: The answer is “False.” NF 1018 is a contractual requirement for the contractor to prepare and submit to the Government Property Administrator and the Installation Financial Officer. See Slide II-35.

Test Questions



- **18. NASA Form 533, NASA Contractor Financial Management Reports, is the official cost reporting document for cost-type and fixed-type contracts.**

True

False

Feedback: The answer is “True.” NF 533 is the official report for reporting contractor financial management data. Forms consist of the NF 533M (monthly), NF 533Q (quarterly), and NF 533P (performance). See Slide II-36.

Test Questions



- **19. When properly completed by the contractor, the NASA Form 533M Report will provide which of the following information?**
 - **General information such as contract type and scope of work**
 - **Information on both planned and actual costs and labor hours for the period, listed by reporting cost category**
 - **The estimated cost and labor to complete the contract**
 - ***All of the above***

Feedback: The answer is “All of the above.” When properly completed, NF 533M will provide all of the cited information plus much more on the contractor financial management status. See Slide II-38.

Test Questions



- **20. NASA Form 533Q, Quarterly Contractor Financial Management Reporting, provides cost and labor hour estimates spread over the life of the contract.**

True

False

Feedback: The answer is “True.” NF 533Q is the official report for quarterly reporting of contractor financial management data. A projection is made with estimates for the entire life span of the contract. See Slide II-39.

Test Questions



- **21. NASA 533M and 533Q reporting forms require that only certain, very specific types of changes to the original contract baseline must be reconciled to the original contract baseline. All other changes are optional.**

True

False

Feedback: The answer is “False.” Traceability to the original contract baseline is mandatory, and any and all changes to the baseline require reconciliation. See Slide II-40.
